

#### TREE REMOVAL POLICY FOR NEW CONSTRUCTION

The goal of this policy is to preserve as much of the Village's tree population while allowing residents to improve their homes and properties.

- When there is a new house or major addition work, a complete site plan shall be submitted showing all underground structures and noting all trees to be removed with size indicated, as well as a landscaping plan. This site plan shall include undersized trees that may be taken down as of right by Village Code.
- Trees to be removed shall be marked at least one week before a site visit.
- ARC letter shall notify neighbors of tree removals (with number of trees) that will be part of the construction.
- ARC shall conduct a site visit to observe trees to be removed and consider alternatives.
- Policy to encourage maintaining property line growth on all sides unless there is a strong argument for removal related to the health of the tree being impacted by the construction process.
- When there is an appeal of the arborist's decision, a second opinion can be sought by the Village at the property owner's expense.

Our Village, Flower Hill had a founding father. Carlos W. Munson born in Havana on November 1869 gave 500 acres to start the village. He fought for incorporation in 1931. Although he never wished to be Mayor, he served as Trustee and Head of the Planning Board for many years. This land gift included Manhasset Woods, Bonnie Heights, Elderfields, etc. He also donated the land that became St. Francis Hospital. Carlos Munson's Real Estate Office became the first Village Hall. It was at the present location.

Munson along with his bride, Mabel came here around 1900. He slowly purchased this land with the help of his family that were in the shipping business. He had a farm on these 500 acres but eventually the farm started to produce fewer product due to excess use and no knowledge of crop rotation.

1930, there was a threat of Port Washington becoming a city. Residents were paying taxes to Port Washington. Mr. Munson spearheaded the start of Flower Hill's incorporation. He mapped out divisions of his property to eventually sell off some of the acres. He circulated the petition that was needed for this area to become a Village. In doing this he gradually bought the surrounding lands. To quote from the minutes, "Mr. Munson was a gentleman of remarkable attainment. He was a keen businessman, a good friend and a fine sportsman." He passed away on July 7, 1940.
