WHEREAS, the Village of Flower Hill desires to advance the Project by making a commitment of 100% of the State share of the costs of the 2020 Pavement and Drainage contract,

RESOLVED, that the sum of \$193, 175.50 is hereby appropriated from the Village 2019-2020 Budget and made available to cover the cost of participation in the above phase of the Project; and it is further

RESOLVED, that in the event the full state share costs of the project exceeds the amount appropriated above, the Board of Trustees shall convene as soon as possible to appropriate said excess amount immediately upon the notification by the Treasurer of the Village of Flower Hill thereof, and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Mayor of the Village of Flower Hill be and is hereby authorized to execute all necessary Agreements, certifications or reimbursement requests for State Aid on behalf of the Village of Flower Hill with the New York State Department of Transportation in connection with the advancement or approval of the Project and providing for the administration of the Project and the Municipality's/Sponsor's first instance funding of project costs and permanent funding of the local share of federal-aid and state-aid eligible Project costs and all Project costs within appropriations therefore that are not so eligible, and it is further

Proposed Local Law No. B of the year 2021

Village of Flower Hill, County of Nassau

A local law authorizing a deferral of tax payments under Chapter 389 of the Laws of 2020

Section 1. Legislative Intent

It is the intent of this local law to allow the Village of Flower Hill to defer the payment of property taxes for a period not to exceed 120 days past the original payment due date, per the Governor's extension, while the COVID-19 state of emergency is in effect.

Section 2. Authority

This local law is adopted pursuant to Chapter 389 of the Laws of 2020, which expressly authorizes a local government's governing body to defer the payment of property taxes for a period not to exceed 120 days past the original payment due date, while the COVID-19 state of emergency is in effect.

Section 3. Severability

If a court determines that any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance is invalid or unconstitutional, the court's order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this local law, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

Section 4. Effective date

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

WHEREAS the Village of Flower Hill requires that taxes be paid no later than July 1 without penalty;

THEREFORE Village taxes will be accepted without penalty until October 20, 2021.

RESOLUTION NO. ___ - February 8, 2021 A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF FLOWER HILL AUTHORIZING THE ADOPTION OF THE NASSAU COUNTY HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN

WHEREAS, all of Nassau County has exposure to natural hazards that increase the risk to life, property, environment and the County's economy; and

WHEREAS, pro-active mitigation of known hazards before a disaster event can reduce or eliminate long-term risk to life and property; and

WHEREAS, The Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (Public Law 106-390) established new requirements for pre and post disaster hazard mitigation programs; and

WHEREAS, a coalition of Nassau County municipalities with like planning objectives has been formed to pool resources and create consistent mitigation strategies within Nassau County; and

WHEREAS, the coalition has completed a planning process that engages the public, assesses the risk and vulnerability to the impacts of natural hazards, develops a mitigation strategy consistent with a set of uniform goals and objectives, and creates a plan for implementing, evaluating and revising this strategy;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the jurisdiction name:1) Adopts in its entirety, the Nassau County Hazard Mitigation Plan (the "Plan") as the jurisdiction's Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan and resolves to execute the actions identified in the Plan that pertain to this jurisdiction.2) Will use the adopted and approved portions of the Plan to guide pre- and post-disaster mitigation of the hazards identified.3) Will coordinate the strategies identified in the Plan with other planning programs and mechanisms under its jurisdictional authority.4) Will continue its support of the Mitigation Planning Committee as described within the Plan.5) Will help to promote and support the mitigation successes of all participants in this Plan.6) Will incorporate mitigation planning as an integral component of government and partner operations.7) Will provide an update of the Plan in conjunction with the County no less than every five years.
